## **POWER OF SIN BROKEN - ROMANS 6**

## **ROMANS 6:1-14**

In Christ the power of sin is broken because we have a new LIFE

## Opens with a question (v.1) — Answers the Christian's Relation to Sin

- ≡ "What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin that grace may abound?" (Ro.6:1)
- » Deals with grace not being used as a license to sin
  - 1. We have new LIFE (**v.8, 11, 13**)
  - 2. We have died to sin (v.3-6)
  - 3. We have been united to Christ in His resurrection (v.5)

## **ROMANS 6:15-23**

In Christ the power of sin is broken because we have a new LORD

- **Opens with a question (v.15) Answers the Christian's Relation to Sin**  $\equiv$  "What then? Shall we sin because we are not under law but under
  - grace? Certainly not!" (Ro.6:15)
  - » Deals with grace not being used as legalism to sin
    - 1. We have a new LORD (Master, i.e., God, v.17)
    - 2. Whoever is our master we obey (v.16)
    - 3. Now righteousness is the rule of our lives (v.18, 22)
