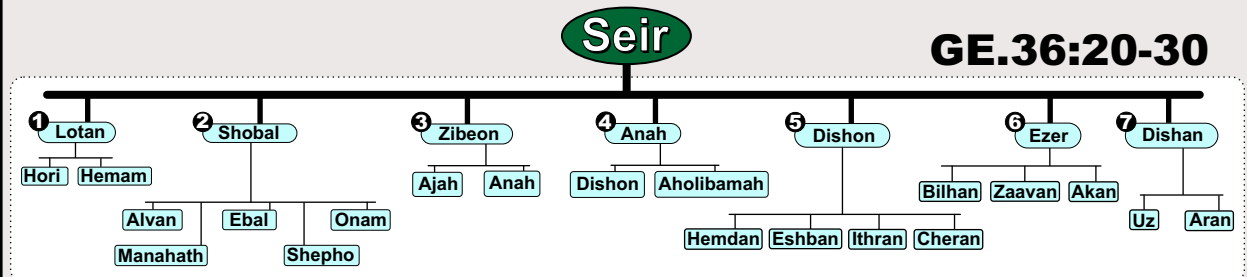
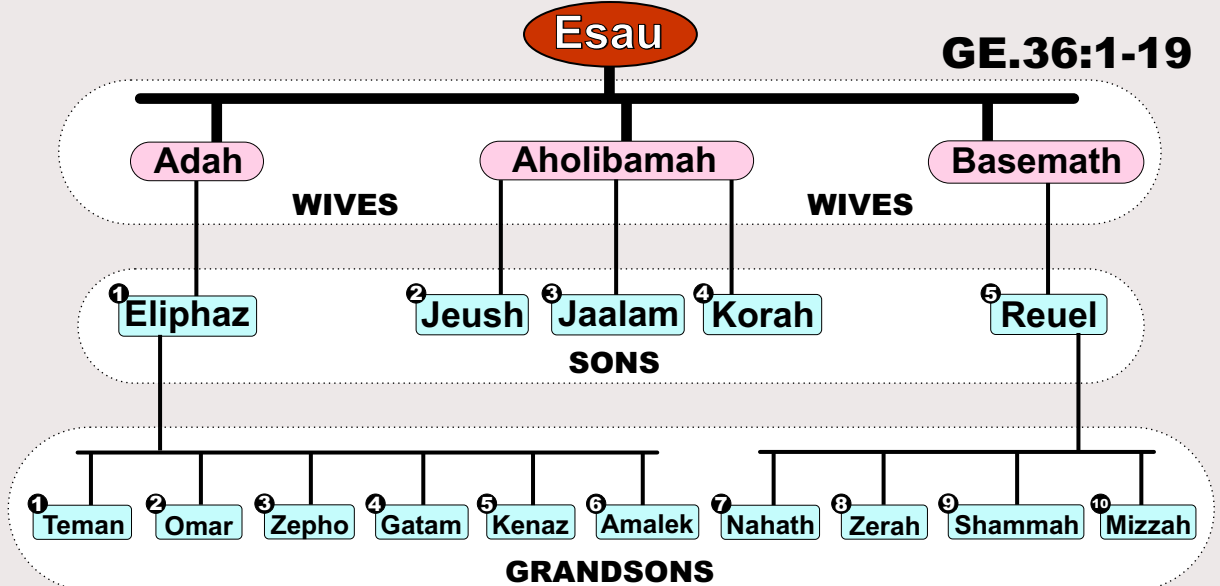
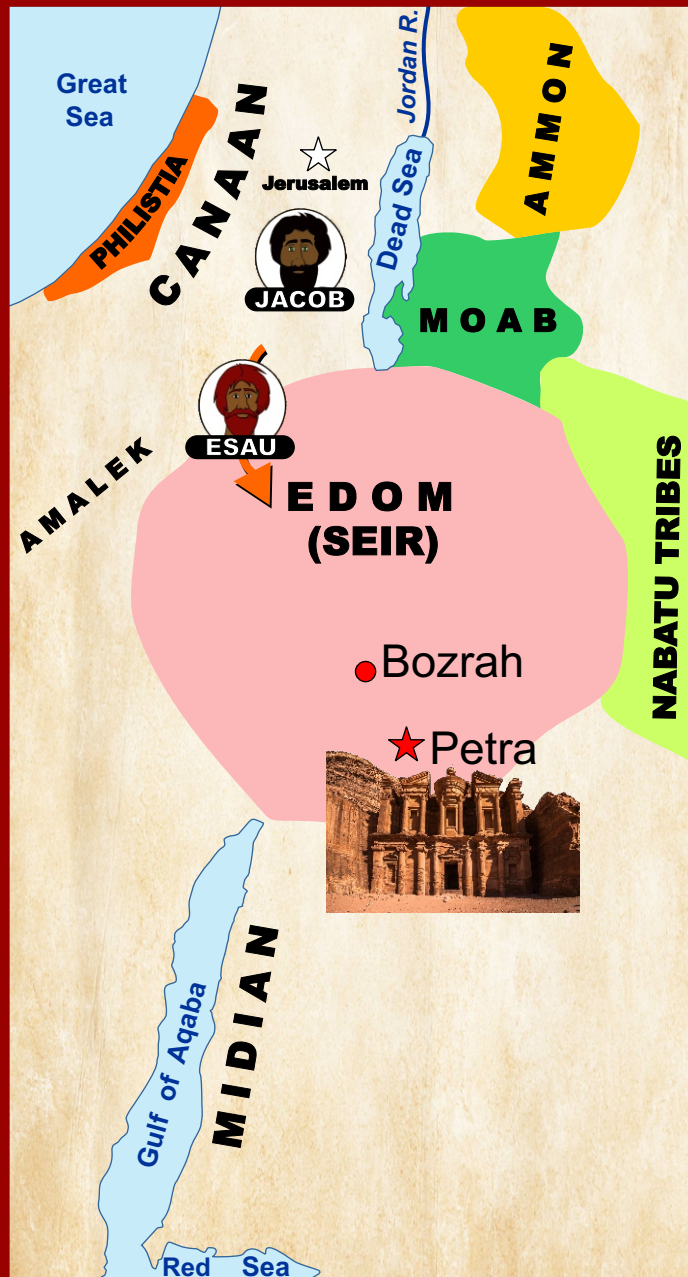


ESAU-EDOM REGION & GENEALOGY — GENESIS 36



SUMMARY

- Esau marries Canaanite women and fathers several sons in the land of Canaan. With growing possessions and livestock, Esau moves to Mount Seir to avoid conflict with his brother Jacob (Ge.36:1-8).
- The sons and grandsons of Esau establish themselves as chiefs in Mount Seir. Each of Esau's sons, from each of his wives, form their respective tribes, contributing to the formation of the Edomite nation (Ge.36:9-19).
- The descendants of Seir the Horite, who inhabited the land before the Edomites, are listed. The chapter concludes with a list of kings who reigned in Edom before the establishment of the Israelite monarchy (Ge.36:20-43).

- Just as God fulfilled His promises to Abraham through Esau's lineage, we can trust that He will fulfill His promises to us, even when the path seems unclear.
- The detailed genealogies remind us that every person and every family has a role in God's plan. We should value and respect each individual's contribution to God's story.
